





US MARINE CORPS CORPORAL SHANE E. KIELION

US Marine Corps Corporal Shane E. Kielion of La Vista, Nebraska, was assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, I Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Pendleton, California and served during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Cpl Kielion was starting quarterback on the Omaha South High School football team and went to Peru State College for a short time on a football scholarship. When that did not work out, he returned to Omaha to work and joined the Marines. Due to his actions in combat, he earned a Silver Star and Purple Heart for wounds received in action. On November 15th, 2004 Cpl Kielion was killed during enemy action in Anbar province, Iraq. He was 23 years old. For Cpl Kielion's wife April Kielion, Nov 15th, 2004, remains a very pivotal day in her life. At 10am her baby was delivered by cesarean section after his fetal heartbeat dropped dangerously low. He was born screaming and healthy. "Oh, my gosh, he looks just like Shane," April's mother said at the time. In a distant Iraq, Shane Kielion lay in a hospital bed, too. He had been shot during a firefight earlier that day on a rooftop in Fallujah. The Rev. Ron Camarda, a navy chaplain, blessed Kielion, pressing a thumb to the Marine's bloody forehead and placing a hand on his chest, according to a 2005 account in the Florida Times Union. A Marine gunnery sergeant held Shane's hand, and the doctors and nurses cried softly. He died a half-hour before his son was born. April waited all day for a phone call from Shane that never came. Shortly after midnight, though, a Marine officer in dress blues arrived at her parents' doorstep with the somber news.





NAVY PETTY OFFICER 1ST CLASS JEFF A. LUCAS

Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Jeff A. Lucas was a 33-year-old, from Corbett, Oregon, assigned to SEAL Team 10 out of Virginia Beach, VA. His team only had two days to get ready for a 6-month assignment in the middle East. On June 28th, 2005, in support of Operation Red Wings, 16 Special Operations Forces (eight SEALS and eight Army Night Stalkers), boarded a helicopter in broad daylight to rescue teammates Marcus Luttrell and three other SEAL team members who had been pinned down by Taliban and al-Qaida fighters during a reconnaissance mission. While ferrying personnel to the battle in their MH-47 Chinook helicopter, enemy fire (possibly a rocketpropelled grenade) brought the aircraft down killing everyone on board. Of the four SEALs on the ground, Marcus Luttrell was the only survivor. It was the worst loss for elite Navy forces since World War II.

NAVY PETTY OFFICER 2ND CLASS JAY A. MORRALL



PO2 Morrall spent a year and a half training at the Naval Nuclear Power Training Command and then the next two and a half years working as a Nuclear Engineering Lab Technician aboard the USS Topeka. Just prior to his passing, PO2 Morrall had re-enlisted for another four years of active duty. His wife Tia recalls, "What I remember most about Jay is his ability to tell great and funny stories. When we were with his shipmates, he always had the ability to make everyone laugh. Being on a submarine, laughter was very helpful during hard times of being stuck under water in tight quarters." Some of PO2 Morrall's awards and decorations included the Navy Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Enlisted Submarine Warfare Insignia, among others.


UNITED STATES ARMY CORPORAL MIDOAMEHA KOMBEY





MILANA LESHIKAR


SARAH SCHERKENBACH


UNITED STATES ARMY CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER 4 CHRIS SCHERKENBACH



UNITED STATES ARMY CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER 4 JASON MCCORMACK




AMIRAH GOODE


UNITED STATES ARMY ARMY CORPORAL JORDAN GOODE


ANABELLE MOMPREMIER


UNITED STATES ARMY CAPTAIN EMERSON MOMPREMIER
