## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### QUALIFICATIONS

You must be the spouse or dependent child of a military service member or first responder who has fallen or been disabled.

Minimum SAT/ACT and GPA: 2.0 or higher term GPA for the two most recent academic terms (Fall and Spring, not Summer). Value of the scholarship: up to \$5,000 per academic year, based on unmet need.

Since its inception in 2007, Folds of Honor has awarded nearly 44,000 scholarships totaling almost \$200 million in all 50 states. Among the students served, 41 percent are minorities. Folds of Honor is proud to have an average ratio of 91 percent of every dollar raised going to our scholarship program.
